



# MS Volga Dream

## Moscow to the Caspian Sea (or reverse) – 13 days/12 nights

Discover the amazing history in the cities along Russia's majestic and beloved Volga River as you cruise from Moscow to the river's delta in the Caspian Sea. From the Golden Horde to the Soviet era, these cities have been witness to some of the most significant events in Russian history.

### Day 1 Moscow

Arrival in Moscow. You will be met and transferred to the MS Volga Dream. **D**

### Day 2 Moscow

This morning's city tour will introduce you to Moscow's wide boulevards and famous landmarks. Continue with a trip on Moscow's ornate metro system. After lunch at a local restaurant, visit the Old Tretyakov Art Gallery to view its extraordinary collection of Russian art ranging from 12th century icons to 20th century paintings. **BLD**

### Day 3 Moscow

Today you visit the Kremlin and explore the State Armoury Museum, housing a spectacular collection of crown jewels, thrones, carriages, Fabergé Eggs, coronation robes and more. Continue to the 15th century Assumption and Archangel Cathedrals. Return to your ship for lunch and begin your cruise along the waterways of Russia. Later this evening, gather for the Captain's welcome reception and dinner. **BLD**



### Day 4 Uglich

Afternoon arrival in Uglich, a charming town dating back to the 10th century. Your walking tour includes the Church of St. Dmitry on the Blood where Tsar Ivan the Terrible's son was murdered, sparking a power struggle for the throne and a period of unrest known as the 'Time of Troubles'. Visit St. John's Church and enjoy a concert of choral music. **BLD**

### Day 5 Yaroslavl

Morning tour of Yaroslavl, founded in 1010 by Prince Yaroslav the Wise and developed as the first port on the Volga. Visit the Spassky Monastery, the Church of St. Elijah the Prophet with its rich frescoes, and take part in a costumed reception at the Governor's House. **BLD**

### Day 6 Nizhny Novgorod

Continue sailing south down the Volga, to arrive in Nizhny Novgorod, one of Russia's main commercial centres. During Soviet times the city was renamed Gorky after the famous Soviet writer. It became the place of exile for dissident physicist Andrei Sakharov and was closed to foreigners. During your city tour you will walk the ramparts of the 16th century Kremlin and later attend a children's folk concert. **BLD**

### Day 7 Kazan

This afternoon disembark in the ancient city of Kazan, capital of the Tatarstan Republic and the land of the Volga Tatars who were allies of the Mongols. Ivan the Terrible conquered Kazan in 1552 and forced its Muslim ruler to convert to Christianity. During your city tour



you'll see the Kremlin and within its walls – the Qolsharif Mosque. Later you will be entertained by a local Tatar folk group. **BLD**

### Day 8 Samara

Mid-morning arrival in Samara, where you will have a city tour and visit the Space Museum. Afterwards, stroll along the Volga esplanade and visit the Samara State Art Museum. Closed to foreigners in the period following WWII, Samara is now the third largest metropolitan area in Russia after Moscow and St. Petersburg. **BLD**

### Day 9 Saratov

Arrival in Saratov – the northernmost colony of the Greek Empire. During the Cold War, Saratov was the centre of Russian military aircraft production. The world's first cosmonaut, Yuri Gagarin, was a member of the Saratov Flying Club. You will have a city tour and visit the Radishev Art Museum. **BLD**

### Day 10 Volgograd

Today you visit Volgograd, known as Stalingrad from 1925 until 1961. The city is famous as the site of one of the pivotal battles of WWII. During your tour of this 'Hero City' you will visit the dramatic Mamaev Mound, with its giant sword-wielding statue of Mother Russia standing guard on its summit. Continue with a tour of the Panorama Museum, dedicated to the Battle of Stalingrad. **BLD**

### Day 11 Cruising

Today is spent on board, relaxing, and taking in the scenery. Evening arrival Astrakhan. **BLD**

### Day 12 Astrakhan

The Khanate of Astrakhan was a Tatar feudal state that was established in the 1460s after the collapse of the Golden Horde. Ivan the Terrible annexed it in 1556. This morning visit a local fortress, built during Ivan's reign. After lunch, you may take part in an optional lecture about the much coveted and precious black caviar, followed by a private tasting. **BLD**

### Day 13 Astrakhan

Tour services end after breakfast, with your transfer to the airport. **B**
